How to take a walk with a preschooler

#### Step 1.

Before we leave the home, first check the clock and see how much time we have to work with.

#### Step 2.

Have a talk with your little one about crossing streets and looking out for cars. Practice this at every road crossing, look both ways

#### Step 3:

I always take the stroller whether she rides or walks beside me because I know by the end of our walk she will be getting tired and will ride more than she walks.

#### Step 4:

Snacks are optional but suggested a bottle of water is nice to have in hot weather. Sometimes we stop by a grocery store and I let her pick out an apple as a treat on the way home. Sometimes the mission of our walk is to pick up a few groceries and save gas, kids like shopping Step 5:

There are always things along the way that are of great interest to little ones. Show them how to make a whistle out of a blade of grass. Show them how the dandelions make little parachutes when you blow on them. Show them the difference between and acorn and a walnut. Give them a handful and count them back to you. See who can throw a walnut the farthest

We go to the park sometimes; if you take, bread along you can feed the ducks. Always go to the playground and let them run for a while, you may have to crawl through the tunnel and down a few slides but it is definitely worth the time to do this.



Do two parents working outside of the home affect the development of children?

The Exosystem is one of the four systems identified in the Ecological Systems Theory. When U. Bronfenbrenner studied how the different environments affected children's development two parents working was unheard of, as there is now. He wrote this theory in 1979. In 2007, many families are working including the teenagers in the household. Many children are in daycare because mothers must go to work, school or both. How has two parents working affected the child's development? Children that are in day care spend less than twenty hours a week with their parents There are parents that insist that children complete their homework because there is no time at home to complete homework When I get home, I am going to school on-line after working all day, this is a typical single parent home. Instead of cooking dinner, busy parents tend to eat at places such as McDonalds. Therefore, children go under-nutrition, have lack of consistency, and under nurtured by their parents. Children without parents really in their lives, do you agree is directly affecting the child's development. The environments in which they are living are ever changing, or have instability from people other than their parents caring for them. Spend every moment you can with your children, a small amount time everyday can help with development i.e. reading a story, eating dinner together etc. Tamar R. Taylor.
