Art - Plan and carry out a task (study habits, independence); Use symbols to represent their ideas

The Reason for Assessment

The issue of assessment and evaluation brings out a wide range of emotions in everyone involved. There is pressure on students to earn good marks; there is pressure on teachers to be fair. The problem of grading young children has never been easy.

The primary reason for conducting assessments is to track each child's work in the beginning years. The initial assessment conducted is for the purposes of screening, diagnosing. Assessments determine the eligibility of special programs for early learners. Documentation showing what the child knows and is able to do should be maintained and passed along from teacher to teacher. There are two other reasons for conducting assessments, program planning and progress monitoring and evaluation.

As we continue to build our assessment toolkit, it is important to understand the purpose of the tool. The assessments strengthens or weakens the required logistic of administering the test. "Assessments must be used carefully and appropriately if they are to resolve, and not create, educational problems" (Bowman, Donovan, & Burns, 2001, p. 235) Mrs. Tamar
